Crisis urbanism: challenges of doing research on the polycritical city

This presentation is about crisis urbanism. There is an urban political economy of crisis. In it, we can distinguish a chrono-politics of crisis urbanism, a spatial-politics of crisis urbanism, a statal-politics of crisis urbanism. The theoretical framing of and methodological approaches to these modalities confront and are challenged by our understanding of poly- and perma-crises associated with the urban way of life. Crisis is understood as an ever-present process in cities, always politically constructed and dialectically composed. The lecture ends with a speculation on a reparative politics of the current conjuncture, one situated within the sociality of urban collective life, building care and commons to move through and beyond crisis urbanism.


LECTURE BY ROGER KEIL

Roger Keil is Distinguished Research Professor at the Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change, York University in Toronto. He researches global suburbanization, urban political ecology, cities and infectious disease, infrastructure, and regional governance. Among his publications are The Globalizing Cities Reader (Routledge, 2017, ed. with Xuefei Ren), Suburban Planet (Polity, 2018), After Suburbia (UTP, ed. with Fulong Wu, 2022), Pandemic Urbanism (Polity, 2023, with S.Harris Ali & Creighton Connolly) and Turning Up the Heat: Urban political ecology for a climate emergency (MUP, ed. with Maria Kaika, Tait Mandler & Yannis Tzaninis, 2023).

Keil is a Fellow of CIFAR's Humanity's Urban Future program.
